### Czech Poet Petr Hruška at the C.S.P.S. Hall by Sally Lieberman

Twenty-five guests gathered at the C.S.P.S. Hall on Friday, March 29 for an evening of poetry in Czech and English. Our esteemed guest from the Czech Republic, Petr Hruška, sometimes called the "Rock Star of Czech Poets," was on a multicity tour of the United States to share his first volume of poems in English, *Everything Indicates* (Leith, Scotland: Blue Diode Press, 2023; translated by Jonathan Bolton). The tour was sponsored by the Czech Literary Centre in Prague. Czech and Slovak Sokol Minnesota, the Czech and Slovak Cultural Center of Minnesota, Literary Ventures, and the Honorary Czech Consulate/Minneapolis co-sponsored the event.

Nolan also read some of his own poems, and Hruška read his original Czech translation of Nolan's poem, "Red Wing Correctional Facility."

Jan Zikmund, of the Czech Literary Centre in Prague, served as interpreter for Hruška; he also offered some of his own insights as well. Hruška expressed his excitement at seeing the Mississippi River for the first time when he arrived from the airport that Friday afternoon; the river figured in one of his first literary works, an adventure novel he wrote when he was eight years old.

# The Accidental Hero: an Outstanding Performance and Sokol Fundraiser

Sokol Minnesota received a wonderful gift in February when Patrick Dewane came forward to donate a performance of *The Accidental Hero* to Czech and Slovak Sokol Minnesota. Patrick is the creator and performer of the story; Sokol members made this all-volunteer event into a very successful fundraiser for the organization's Legacy Fund (maintenance and renovation of the C.S.P.S. Hall). Nearly 150 people attended the April 13 performance.

The evening began with an hour of contemporary jazz by Czech-born

Pavel Jany on the guitar. As theatre goers gathered at the Hall on a very warm April 13 evening, the music set the mood as

guests enjoyed a cold glass of Pilsner Urquell or Pinot Grigio, along with zelničky sauerkraut crackers provided by the Czech Heritage Club (New Prague).

Patrick Dewane has performed his one-man show several hundred times, both here in the United States and in the Czech Republic. It is the story of his grandfather Matt Konop's World War II experiences and the awakening of his pride in his Czech heritage.

More than a few tears rolled down

cheeks during the quick-paced dramatic tale about the anguish, the trauma, the terrible destruction of wars, and the importance of fighting for freedom over tyranny. Patrick's portrayal of several characters, plus sound effects, old photos, and actual footage on Matt Konop's own movie camera, brought the realities of that war (trenches, Nazi prisoners on a death march) directly to the audience. The audience gave Patrick a long standing ovation. ### Highlights of the Sokol Minnesota Board of Directors March 2024 Meeting

The Czech and Slovak Sokol Minnesota Board of Directors convened on March 21, 2024. The meeting commenced with a call to order and attendance verification, followed by the approval of the February meeting minutes.

Jason Brozovich spoke for the Youth Leadership Award Committee to propose that Sokol Minnesota increase the award amount from \$200 to \$400 each for up to three recipients. This proposal, along with an additional \$100 contribution from Honorary Czech Consul M.L. Kucera, bringing the total award to \$500 each, was approved.

A motion was passed to appoint Mary Cahill, Joan Sedlacek, and M.L. Kucera as representatives to the Western District (WD) of American Sokol on behalf of Sokol Minnesota with the clarification that these representatives would oversee matters beyond gymnastics. Jason Brozovich, as Sokol Minnesota's Women's and Men's Director, automatically represents Sokol Minnesota on the WD Board, with two votes (one for Women's Director and one for Men's Director).

The Board approved the printing of 2,000 postcards (up from last year's 1,500) to promote the 35th annual Czech & Slovak Festival on September 29.

Brittany Stepan resigned from her position as Chair of the Publicity Committee.

There was an issue with patrons purchasing tickets online for *The Accidental Hero* performance receiving no confirmation email or receipt. (The requested implementation of an automated system rectified this problem.)

Reminder: all website-change requests should be submitted to Cinnamon Whaley.

Regarding stage scenery repair: partial repair of stage scenery has been completed. We hope to get grant funds to do more repair and preservation work. Wendy Waszut-Barrett, an expert on the repair of the scenery, offered to explain the history and value of the scenery to the Board and then at a later time to a broader audience if interested. There is a Stage Committee.

A donation request for the Western District Special Assessment Fund (\$50) and the Trophy Fund (\$75) for the April 27 competition in Sokol South Omaha were approved. The Board agreed to participate in a neighborhood event at Saint Stanislaus Catholic Church on June 8, with plans to have a table showcasing Sokol and volunteers to staff it.

Volunteers needed.

President Lucy Rose presented a proposed fee structure for Sokol-sponsored or co-sponsored and non-Sokol events. The Board expressed interest in forming a committee to explore additional options for Hall use.

The Board of Instructors reported on preparations for the upcoming Western District Slet/Gymnastics Competition and end-of-year gymnastics party. Also, collaboration with Kung Fu instructors for a one-day self-defense class is underway.

The Building and Trustee Committee proposed planting two autumn blaze maple trees and four regal oak trees, securing a new elevator maintenance contract, and applying for a grant to improve the elevator pit and heating system.

The Education Committee reported on ongoing language classes, a successful Dumpling Master Class, and proposed baking workshops with a renowned Czech baking expert. These workshops were subsequently approved.

The Finance Report highlighted a computer replacement and the recommendation to sub-grant a portion of the 2024 Czech government grant to Czech & Slovak School Twin Cities (*škola*). Three new member applications were approved.

The Gaming Committee received approval to increase the gaming worker's pay and award a bonus for his 2023 work. The Sunshine Committee sent a get-well card to Tom Aubrecht. The meeting concluded with a motion to adjourn.
